VI. Agenda 2: Progress Since the 4th Tripartite Meeting

The three parties reviewed the pragmatic results each party achieved respectively:

1. GPDE(CAECW) :

- a) 281 bilateral and multilateral cooperation agreements or memorandums were signed among governments, schools, enterprises of China and ASEAN



Countries;

- b) *Joint Announcement on China-ASEAN Educational Cooperation Action Plan to Support ASEAN Education Work Plan (2016-2020)* was launched jointly by Ministries of Education of China and ASEAN Countries;
- c) proposal of an upgraded version of the "Double 100,000 plan" to bring ASEAN-China student exchanges to 300,000 person times by 2025. To meet this goal, China will set up "China-ASEAN Maritime Silk Road Scholarships";
- d) "China-ASEAN Qingzhen TVET Centre", "China-ASEAN Rail Transit Education and Training Alliance", "China-Cambodia Preschool Teachers' Training Center" were established;
- e) Southeast Asian Scholarships were implemented by SEAMEO in collaboration with GPDE and JPDE;
- f) *Guidebook to Education System and Reforms in Southeast Asia and China*, a joint work by NIES, ACC and SEAMEO, was published.

2. SEAMEO :

- a) 87 Jasmine Jiangsu Tertiary Education Scholarships and 55 Guizhou Government Scholarship were provided for Southeast Asia Students;
- b) provided internships including one university lecturer from GPDE, position at SEAMEO Secretariat in Bangkok to promote Chinese language communication for one month;
- c) held JPDE TVET Dialogue;
- d) conducted TVET mobility and networking programme;
- e) held the 3rd Southeast Asia-China Education Research Network Meeting in Thailand in September 2016;
- f) carry out China-ASEAN University Presidents Forum with CAECW organizing committee, ACC, ACAETC & Education Department of Hainan Province in October 2016;
- g) held Jiangsu-SEA High School Networking Programme with JPDE and ACC in November 2016;
- h) conducted Jiangsu Tour for Youth Envoys with JPDE and ACC in November 2016.



3. ACC

- a) held various activities participated by ASEAN students in China throughout the year:
 - Logo Design for the Year of ASEAN-China Educational Exchange
 - Beijing-ASEAN Student Games
 - New Year's Gala
 - The 1st Youth Summer Camp
 - Youth Leadership Summit.
- b) promote ASEAN-China TVET cooperation;
- c) held workshops and encouraged Zhejiang Yalong Company to contribute education equipment and training courses to Myanmar;
- d) helped Chinese provinces to connect with ASEAN partners;
- e) organized higher education delegation from Sichuan and Hainan provinces to visit ASEAN;
- f) organized ASEAN partners to visit Guizhou, Jiangsu, Shanghai and Hainan provinces in China;
- g) conducted eight activities in collaboration with SEAMEO and GPDE (CAECW) during the 9th CAECW:
 - China-ASEAN Information Publishing Platform for Educational Cooperation
 - China-Southeast Asia TVET Mobility and Networking Programme with SEAMEO Secretariat
 - Traditional Medicine and Health Professional Education Forum, with joint work of SEAMEO TROPMED
 - China-ASEAN University Presidents Cooperation Forum, which was themed “Collaborative Innovation: Win-win Cooperation”
 - China-ASEAN Vocational Education Cooperation Dialogue, jointly with Jiangsu Provincial Department of Education
 - China-ASEAN EngTech University Presidents Forum under the theme “the opportunity and challenge for China-ASEAN higher education under



the Belt and Road Initiative”

- 12th Soong Ching Ling Award for Children’s Invention
- International Production Capacity Cooperation and Talent Cultivation Forum which was co-hosted by the CAECW Secretariat and Guizhou Provincial Government

VII. Agenda 3: Preparation for the 10th CAECW and related activities in 2017

- 1 . Mr. Liu Baoli from CAECW briefed on the initial plans and draft programme for the 10th CAECW
 - a) theme: Share a Decade Achievements in Educational Cooperation, Start a New Chapter along with the Belt and Road Initiative
 - b) time: curtain-up period from July 28 to August 3 2017, Other activities will be held throughout the year of 2017
 - c) venue: activities of curtain-up period will be held in China-ASEAN International Conference Centre in Guiyang, Guizhou; other activities will be held in difference places of China and ASEAN countries
 - d) participants: from governmental organizations, educational institutes, universities and schools, diplomatic organizations, enterprises, media from ASEAN countries, China and special guest countries
 - e) activities in curtain-up period: 100 China-ASEAN Presidents Cooperation for the Future, China-ASEAN Youth Exchange Series, China-ASEAN Culture Exchange Series, The third China-ASEAN TVET Expo, China-ASEAN Education Cooperation and Talent Exchange Fair
 - f) activities for the 10th anniversary commemoration: 10th CAECW Logo Design Competition, 10th anniversary memorial album and documentary, China-ASEAN Education Cooperation Dialogue, China-ASEAN Education Cooperation Think Tank Thoughts, 10th CAECW Anniversary Celebration Gala Evening
 - g) other activities throughout 2017
- 2 . Mr. Liu Baoli from CAECW suggested the three parties cooperate on the 10th CAECW in the following ways:
 - a) involve programmes related to China-ASEAN educational exchanges and



cooperation at the 10th CAECW

- hold activities of China-ASEAN educational exchanges during the curtain-up period of the 10th CAECW
 - present achievements of China-ASEAN educational cooperation at the 10th CAECW
 - hold activities under the title of the 10th CAECW throughout the year of 2017 in China and ASEAN countries
- b) propagate CAECW at the media platform
- introduce CAECW at ACC internet platform and the activities ACC participates in
 - introduce CAECW at SEAMEO internet platform, SEAMEO Centres and the activities SEAMEO participates in
 - GPDE (CAECW) provides promotional materials to ACC and SEAMEO
- c) invite participants
- ACC assists to invite Embassies of 10 ASEAN countries in China and its partners
 - SEAMEO assists to invite schools and universities of ASEAN countries, related international organizations and its partners
 - GPDE (CAECW) invites participants of previous CAECWs and provides invitation materials to ACC and SEAMEO
- d) other proposals
- develop “China-ASEAN Qingzhen TVET Centre” with vocational educational resources jointly and make it an important platform for the exchanges of vocational education between China and ASEAN countries
 - GPDE (CAECW) invites universities and colleges of Guizhou as co-organizers of programs implemented by ACC and SEAMEO in Guizhou
 - SEAMEO and GPDE continue to cooperate on SEA scholarship 2017 to assist Guizhou universities and colleges to recruit SEA students

3 . Dr. Gatot Hari Priowirjanto from SEAMEO suggests to

- SEAMEO-China Cultural Twinning Programmes for TVET leaders/teachers/lecturers
 - TVET principal/Polytechnic Rector Dialogue with JPDE, in Education-to-Enterprise Model
 - categorize activities into seven priority areas
 - 4th Southeast Asia-China Education Research Network meeting with ACC and NIES, MOE of China
- b) conduct other activities in 2017
- encourage to provide 87 Jasmine Jiangsu tertiary education scholarship, 200 Sun Yat-sen University's scholarship, 1028 Guizhou Government Scholarship, at least 50 Hainan Government scholarship for Southeast Asia student
 - promote the 10th CAECW during the International Congress on Education 2017, 3-4 May in Bangkok
 - SEAMEO-China Fellowship Programme, such as professors or experts exchanges between ASEAN and China universities or educational exchanges
 - support other forums organized by SEAMEO members and partners
 - train 100 to 200 TVET teachers in Oct/Nov for 3 weeks in 7 fields, such as hospitality and tourism, electronics, Mechatronics & Manufacturing, Structural Engineering (construction), Agricultural & Fisheries, Maritime, Railway Engineering, Mining

4 . Ms. Kong Roatlomang responded to Mr. Liu's suggestions and informed that ACC will

- a) hold the following three activities during the 10th CAECW:
- Inaugural Meeting of ASEAN-China Consortium for Cooperation in TVET and Forum on Integration of Production and Education
 - the 1st Conference on China-ASEAN Cooperation of Science and Technology and the Unveiling Ceremony of China-ASEAN Institute of Science and Technology
 - ASEAN-China Forum on Tourism Education Cooperation



b) hold the following activity in another occasions:

- the 1st Chinese Language Competition of ASEAN Students in Beijing, Tianjin and Hebei of China

c) conduct other activities over 2017

- promote CAECW on ACC official website and in relevant activities ACC participates in China and ASEAN
- invite diplomats of ASEAN Embassies in China and its partners to attend activities it organized during the CAECW
- promote student mobility and introduce new scholarship programmes by provincial governments and universities of China for ASEAN students
- collaborate with SEAMEO on proposed programmes including the 4th Southeast Asia-China Educational Research Network which NIES will jointly work together

VIII. Agenda 4: Consensuses and adoption of Minutes of the 5th Tripartite Meeting

1. The meeting reviewed the achievements of the 9th CAECW and the cooperation among three parties. All sides agreed that the 9th CAECW achieved great success.
2. The three parties recognized that the tripartite cooperation mechanism is very efficient and shall be further strengthened.
3. The parties all attached great importance to the 10th CAECW and agreed to work together in line with the theme of the 10th CAECW for the success of the event.
4. ACC and SEAMEO agreed to organize various programmes during the 10th CAECW, including during the curtain-up period and at other occasions through the year. The CAECW Secretariat appreciated their commitments and promised to provide necessary support.
5. ACC and SEAMEO will help to promote the 10th CAECW through their channels including the official websites and relative activities.
6. ACC and SEAMEO expressed their commitments to promoting student mobility and exchanges of teachers and lecturers between ASEAN and China.
7. ACC and SEAMEO will facilitate the invitation of guests from ASEAN Embassies in Beijing and ASEAN universities/colleges, and introduce their



partners to participate in the relative activities during the 10th CAECW.

8. ACC and SEAMEO will discuss with NIES about details of the 4th Southeast-China Education Research Network.
9. In view of the expansion of the function of CAECW Secretariat, the parties will explore possibilities of further cooperation beyond the curtain-up period of CAECW. The parties agreed to discuss all the details later.
10. Secretary-General Yang Xiuping was delighted to accept the invitation from CAECW Secretariat to attend the China-ASEAN School-Enterprise Cooperation Dialogue for “One Belt and One Road” International Talent Training, and it is hoped that Director Dr. Gatot would also give it positive consideration.
