B. Background, Description and Objectives of the Activity

1. *The Southeast Asia Primary Learning Metrics (SEA-PLM) is a regional assessment programme for end-of primary students measuring literacy in Reading, Writing, Mathematics and Global Citizenship. In addition to providing regional contextualized quality measures for learning outcomes, the initiative aims to build in-country capacity to strengthen regional technical collaboration and standards across education systems in the ASEAN region. This technical support has been provided by the experts from ACER based on their extensive expertise and experience in international learning assessments.*
2. *SEA-PLM is unique in its approach as it is the first large scale multi-country assessment to successfully include the assessment of writing across different scripts. In the same manner, the inclusion of the Global Citizenship domain ensures the programme aligns with regional aspirations and commitment of promoting a culture of peace and understanding through education. To ensure relevance with the national and regional contexts, the tools and protocols of SEA-PLM have been developed in close collaboration between ACER and the SEAMEO Member Countries.*
3. *Currently, field trials were conducted in Brunei Darussalam, Lao PDR, Cambodia and Myanmar have been completed*
4. *For 2018, SEA PLM Field Trials was implemented in the Philippines and Vietnam.*
5. *For this mission, it is the Field Trial in Malaysia which is in the process of completing their field trials.*
